Europe and Australia

We are grateful to the various scribes of the British Golf Collectors Society and other European and Australian hickory organizers whose reports on several championships were the basis for the following brief summaries. The year 2020 saw a large number of cancellations and reduced attendance for those events that did

MAY

28 - Scottish Hickory Championship

Played at the Fortrose and Rosemarkie Golf Club, the championship was played on an overcast day with dark, low cloud and a nippy breeze. The sun eventually shone on the 24 competitors.

Neil Gascoigne shot a 79 to win the scratch prize. Ian Hislop, co-organiser of the event with Hamish Ewan, took the championship title with an impressive 85-14=71, two strokes ahead of runner-up Jamie White. Our Captain, Carolyn Kirk, awarded both winners commemorative medals supplied generously by former Captain David Kirkwood, who was among the competitors.

JULY

24 - French Hickory Championship, Golf Club Lys Chantilly

Monsieur Gee won the Open Division with 34 points. Monsieur Gorczyca won the Net Division with 38 points.

AUGUST

4-5 - Spanish Hickory Open, Real Nuevo Club de Golf SS Basozabal

Gonzalo Retana Ardanaz reports: This third San Sebastian Hickory Golf Open has been a charity event for the benefit of the NGO of the College of Engineers of Gipuzkoa, with the proceeds going to the

Nyabunyunyi school, located in the Kimomo village on the island of Idjwi in the Congo. A ProAm was held on Wednesday the 4th and the individual championship on Thursday the 5th.

More than 40 players were from the Basozabal club, including noted professional Jose Maria Olazabal, who was the overall winner of the championship. He was followed by Guillermo Retana, one stroke behind, and Miguel Carrasco third. The amateur scratch for Guillermo Retana. 7-8 - Swedish Hickory Championship

8 – Central England Hickory Cham-

Played at Luffenham Heath GC, the event also includes the Seniors Championship and John Hanna Tankard. A small but select field teed off in this event which had to be cancelled in 2020.

The winner of the Tony Thorpe trophy was Geoff Bleasby with an excellent score of 35 stableford points. Geoff was also the winner in 2017.

The Seniors Championship was won by Chris Walker with 32 points and the John Hanna Tankard, which is now for members aged 70 and over, was won by by Tony Hunt with 31 points. The winner of of the scratch prize was Christian McMillan with a gross 81.

13-15 - German Hickory Championship

Petra Hellmann reports: Forty-two participants from seven European countries and various German cities competed in the 13th German Open Hickory Championship. Under

the motto "Germany against the rest of the world," 28 players engaged in a fourball best ball match play on Friday with golfers from Austria, England, France, the Netherlands, Slovakia, Sweden, and Switzerland. The rest of the world team won 5:2.

The first round of the German Open Hickory Championship was a stroke play event over 36 holes. Professionals played for a prize money of 5,000 €. Englishman Brian Gee won with a 154 total. Germany's golf legend and former European Tour player Heinz-Peter Thül from Cologne was runner-up with 159 strokes. Vechta's golf pro Glyn Morris came in third.

In the amateur gross ranking, 14-year-old Louis Dudzus from Berlin-Wannsee won the "Tanfani di Montalto Cup" with 174 strokes ahead of Dr. Hendrik Hilgert from Hamburg (176 strokes). In the women's gross, Angela Moser from Augsburg needed 178 strokes to win the "Lilien-Pokal". Helmut Betz from Ingolstadt won the men's net with 133 strokes. Erika Frey from Switzerland won the women's net with 159 strokes.

26-28 – Swiss Hickory Championship

Rick Adams reports: Carmen Sagarra, playing from the Hittnau Golf & Country Club in eastern Switzerland, won the women's division, and PGA teaching professional Paolo Quirici from Golf Club Lugano in the southern Ticino region won the men's open division at the Swiss Hickory Open at Golf Club Limpachtal in Buchegg.

Thirty-seven hickory golfers, representing 17 different golf clubs, participated in multiple categories.

Leveraging a long, Daly-esque backswing, Sagarra posted a two-day total of 192, seven strokes in front of runner-up Susanna Weber. Susanne Lauber earned the women's net title with 67 points.

Described as Switzerland's most successful professional golfer, Quirici played on the European PGA Tours from 1989 to 2001, then won the U.S. Professional Hickory Championships (Temple Terrace, Fla.) in 2013 and 2014 and the World Hickory Championship in Scotland in 2013. Quirici's two-day total of 144 matched par (70-74). He won by 12 strokes over young Andri Hausamman (best amateur), who had taken Quirici to the final hole in last year's Swiss Hickory Match Play on the same

The men's best net in the open division was Joe Lauber, founder of JBL Hickory Golf clubs. Nick Hofer led the Stableford men's competition with 35 points, four ahead of Maurus Lauber and Helmut Betz. Betz was best net Stableford.

SEPTEMBER

3 – Scotland v England Hickory Championship

Played at Dunbar, 24 members met for the 27th Scotland v England hickory match. Despite benign, overcast conditions, the course remained challenging, with well-defined fairways and fast, curvy greens. Match results fluctuated in favour of both teams before settling to a companionable tie at three points apiece, Scotland retaining the trophy they won last year at Goswick.

OCTOBER

8 – English Hickory Championship – Rye GC

Nigel Notely reports: The 2021 English Hickory Championship was played in respect of the Scratch Championship, after three years of domination by the Rye pro, Matthew Holland, the new winner is Ralph Evans from Flempton in Suffolk. He shot gross 76 with a 2-shot penalty for not wearing a

jacket, taking him to 78. Louie Highfield (Rye assistant pro) was 2nd on 80. The English Hickory Champion (winner of the Founders Salver, stableford off handicap) with 38 points was Britte Nolle the first lady to win. Jenny Hunt was 2nd on 37.

26-29 – BGCS Hickory Grail

Played over the Old, New, and Jubiliee courses in St Andrews. This is the binennial match between European and American members of the BGCS, last played at Trinity Forest, Dallas, Texas. The European Team retained the Hickory Grail trophy with a 15 matches to 13 victory over the American team.

JANUARY

23 – Winter Park Hickory Classic – Winter Park GC, Winter Park, Fla.

Although a bit soggy, the Winter Park Hickory Classic started off the year for the Florida Hickory Golfers. The winner of the gross trophy was Will Peterson with a score of 71. The net trophy was secured by Tom McCray in a scorecard playoff with David Webster. On the Ladies side, Marci Likens took the gross honors and Natalie Wells the net award, with Beth Chambers in second place reserve.

FEBRUARY

20-22 – U.S. Professional & Amateur Hickory Championships

Played at the Temple Terrace Golf and Country Club in Temple Terrace, Fla. Mike Stevens reports: For the third consecutive year, Boca Raton professional Jeremy Moe captured the John Shippen Cup to become the U.S. Professional Hickory Golfer of the Year. Seventeen professionals and 18 amateurs entered the 2021 contest held Monday, Feb. 22 at the historic Temple Terrace Golf Course, near Tampa, Fla. Moe's 73 bested former champion Dylan Malafronte by 4 shots.

On the amateur side, Will Peterson's 78 beat Bill Geisler by two strokes to take the Oscar Bunn Trophy. Scott Bowles recorded a net 63 to earn the Heritage title.

27-28 – The Arizona Desert Hickory Classic

Played on the Grandview & Pebblebrook Golf Courses. The tournament supported a field for Championship, Senior, New-To-Hickory, Super Senior and Ladies.

In the Championship Division, Bill "Ernie" Ernst of Sun City West, Ariz. was overall Tournament Champion, shooting a two-day 75 / 80. Jason Reynolds of Griswold, Iowa, took second, posting 77 / 80.

Senior division winner was Kevin Cawley from Omaha, Neb., shooting 81 on the first day and 80 on day two. Ed Horvat of Sun City West, came in second in Seniors with an 83 on the second day.

The New-To-Hickory Division winner was Keith "Woody" Woods, from El Mirage, Ariz., with 96 / 87. Runner Up was Mike Pedersen of Phoenix, Ariz., with 94 / 93. The Super Senior Division was won by Tom Tracy of Star, Idaho, with 79 / 78, Runner Up was Chuck McCollum of Rocklin, Calif., shooting 85 / 80 winning in a scorecard playoff.

The Ladies Division winner was Rylee Stovall of Litchfield Park, Ariz., shooting 79/89. The Runner Up was Susan Tracy of Star, Idaho, with 88 / 84.

MARCH

25-27 - Onion Creek/Swift Trophy

Played over the Onion Creek Golf Course in Austin, Texas. Pete League reports: Several First Tee teams from Texas turned out for an inaugural national First Tee Hickory Tournament. The Dallas team of Jacob Lewallen, Jacob Castro, Zach Lewallen, and Eric Ramos turned in a total team score of 140 for the day's honors.

Veteran golf broadcaster Verne Lundquist joined the event for the awards ceremony and was pleased to honor tournament supporter Virgil Swift with an honorary Vardon Jacket, which is annually awarded to the tournament champion.

Ken Jackson took first place in the Senior Division; John Hutton in the Statesman Division; and Jeremy Wright continued his winning ways at Onion Creek with another victory, just nipping 2019 USHO Champion Rick Woeckener by two.

In the scramble division, Rives McBee with Scott Pilgrim, Gary Krupkin, and Michael Sloan took the title.

The Tad Moore Award for a younger player with respect for the traditions of the game was given to Danny Holcomb. The Johnny Henry Award for the low net award by a member of the Golf Heritage Society went to Hardy Moore. And the Russ Fisher Award for an outstanding tournament volunteer was given to Donna Smith.

17 - Sunflower Hickory Match Play

In the Open Division Gordon Preddy was the overall champion and low gross at 156) in a playoff over Mark Hollingsworth, also at 156. Graham Stevens nipped Peter Bliudzius by 2 to take low net honors with 145 (+1).

In the Senior Divison Deal Hudson won with a 79 on day two to capture low gross honors with 164. Richard Schmidt beat Russell Eaves on the first playoff hole to take runner up honors. David Kubly captured low net honors with 138 (-6), while the Charles Mitchell took second with 141 (-3).

18-20 – 7th Pacific Northwest Hickory Championship

Played at at Longview Country Club (est. 1923) in Longview, Wash., on June 18-20. Martin Pool reports:

Fifty-six players were a new record for this event. John Quickstad kicked off the tournament with a ceremonial tee shot using his grandfather's mashie. His grandfather, Reynolds 'Herb' Hoover, was a member at Longview Country Club during the 1920s and 30s and reportedly held the course record at one time.

Matt's daughter, Rylee, shot 87-86 to take the Women's Open title. John Henry Williams claimed the Senior title with a 78-78, and Dennis Scott captured the Statesmen title with a score of 82-83.

On the net side, Brad Harvey was the Open Net Champion, Floyd Lockie the Senior Net Champion, Steve 'Dog' Franich the Statesmen Net Champion, and Ellie Lathrop, Longview member and first-time hickory player, was the Women's Net Champion.

AUGUST

11-13 - 22nd Canadian Open Hickory Championship

Played on The Legends Golf and Country Club in Edmonton, Alberta. CC - August 11/12/13, 2021

With the ongoing world wide pandemic we were fortunate to be able to still run a modified Canadian Open Hickory Championship. A total of 82 (up from 68 last year) participants came for the three-day event with 70 teeing it up for the Friday Championship.

High winds marked the popular 4-person scramble this year which had 14 teams. Ron St. John's team turned in a sparkling 63 to take the first place prize.
