The Course

Hilly, with ample bunkers and water, the Donald Ross Course will provide a true test for U.S. Hickory Open competitors



It's a par 70, just shy of 6,000 yards, or 5,050 for the ladies (or senior hickory players). The Ross tees are 6,500 and the tips take you back to 7,030. The course hosted the 1924 PGA and since has been a favorite for any number of Indiana championships. Course record of 62 is held by Denny Helpler of Warsaw, Ind. who, in 1990, won the entirely modest and unassuming Indiana Assistants' Championship.

Bent grass greens, heavily grassed walls on sand bunkers. Lots of mature trees and water on several holes. Elevation changes come often and often unwanted. Flat lies are few. A few years ago, the resort collaborated with the Donald Ross Society to restore the course to the architect's intentions – 35 bunkers were brought back, with flat bottoms and deep faces. Greens were expanded to original square or rectangular shapes.

To ease any pain that might arise, there is a full bar.

The Ross course is ranked by Golfweek as one of the two best That You Can Play (a happily optimistic assumption) in Indiana.

The famous who have tested the course include Walter Hagen, Gene Sarazen, Bing Crosby, Bob Hope, Patty Berg, local boy Larry Bird, and Fuzzy Zoeller.
