

# 'Our' Course



# Longtime friends, golfing rivals on their favorite Wisconsin course

Bill "Ernie" Ernst watched as Steve Simer launched another towering drive during a practice round at Lawsonia. Shaking his head, he said, "If you want to beat Steve, you can't get caught up in his length. He is wiry and you can't beat him that way."

Ernst and Simer met about seven years ago. Ernst has been playing hickory golf for perhaps a dozen years, while Simer picked it up just five years ago. The two are close in handicaps (7.2 and 6.8) and often together in final pairings.

"If I want to beat Ernie, I need to play solid, steady golf and hope he tries to overpower it and that it makes the ditch," Simer said. "I call him a gunslinger, and he calls me a sniper because I always aim for the middle of the green. Par against him is a great score... if I get enough of them."

Both gentlemen are regulars in Wisconsin Hickory Golfer outings where, to the battered

resignation of their peers, one or the other will take top honors. Each says the Links Course at Lawsonia is their favorite course and they, like the rest of their Wisconsin peers, are eagerly looking forward to the 2016 USHO.

"The course is extrememly fair but shots must be accurate," Ernst says. "Tee shots are not the challenge at Lawsonia. Fairways are wide and there are no trees. Hitting the green is fairly easy because the greens are very large, but hitting them in the right spot is the challenge. (That's Simer you hear laughing.) All the holes provide a run-up area. The key is putting and judging yardage on approach shots with the wind. Competition will come from those who manage the greens."

Simer agrees the course is a fair challenge.

"It also has the ability make you pay severely for your mistakes," he says. "Fairways and greens will be a secret to winning the U.S.

Hickory Open here. You have to put your ball on the green in the right spot to have a chance at par or better. A score right around even par or maybe even a few over par will win."

The stiffest competition, Simer believes, will come from Mother Nature and the stiff and fickle winds typical of the late summer and early fall. Those dairy land zephyrs will easily turn a par 72 course into par 75 or 76 and make the inattentive golfer feel like he's on the edge of a cliff chasing a balloon.

**OPENED FOR PLAY** in 1928, the course was designed by the famed team of William B. Langford and Theodore Moreau. It features multi-tiered greens, some 90 bunkers, and deep rough over 140-some acres.

The architects developed many of their links ideas from a visit to Scotland where they sketched and photographed famous golf holes.

"Hazards should not be built solely with the idea of penalizing bad play, but with the object of encouraging thoughtful golf and of rewarding the player who possesses the ability to play a variety of strokes with each club," Langford said (quote from Geoff Shackleford's Golden Age of Golf Design.)

Legend has it that a boxcar was buried under the seventh green to form its huge green elevation. The Links Course took \$250,000 to construct, almost an unheard of cost in those days.

Hogan, Snead and Nelson all played here and the course is ranked in the Top 100 course in the U.S. by Golf Digest.

THE LAND'S HISTORY features as many twists as do its cunning greens. A thunderstorm that forced their boat ashore on the western end of Green Lake in the mid-1880s led to Victor and Jessie Lawson purchasing the land. That grew into an 1,100-acre tree farm and an elaborate estate with an Italian-tiled boathouse for three electric boats, formal gardens and seven water towers.

After the Lawson's passing, the property was sold to a reputed Mafia-owned company that put CONTINUED NEXT PAGE

\$3 million more into the place to create a luxury resort with bar, casino, exquisite dining room, and outdoor pool. Those renovations included the current links course.

The development fell prey to the Great Depression and closed. Later, portions of the property were used to house 450 German WWII POWs who worked nearby canneries. The course, meanwhile became a cow pasture.

In 1943, the Northen Baptist Assembly (the current owners) bought the place for \$300,000. They restored the original links and added additional nines in 1983 and 1991.

Now that it will host a U.S. Hickory Open, Lawsonia has surely come into its own. •
